LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Friends,

As I reflect on the past difficult year, there was a common thread to my exit interviews with each graduating student. In this time of fear and uncertainty, each one spoke about how the Maharat community sustained them. Our students come from diverse backgrounds and religious leanings within the spectrum of Orthodoxy, they are at different life stages, and hail from Israel, Australia, France, London, Switzerland, and across the United States. Despite the uniqueness of each member of our student body, our graduates overwhelmingly express that being a member of the Maharat community is the most powerful part of their experience. Our faculty are superb and the Torah is rigorous, but our students walk out of the Maharat beit midrash with a like-minded network, a community of shared purpose.

Much like Bnei Yisrael who were gathered at the foot of Har Sinai in the desert, we are a yeshiva that is made up of distinct tribes. Bnei Yisrael, up until this point in history, have operated as a fractured group, but at this crucial moment, as they are about to receive the Torah, Rashi famously describes them as *k'ish echad*, *b'lev echad*, "like one person with one heart."

It is this shared bond, this growing network of women, that gives our community the power to soar. Our 75 alumnae out in the field are serving in 10 countries, with over 60 more students coming up through our pipeline. Yeshivat Maharat is blessed with a community of Torah learners who are truly *k'isha achat, b'lev echad*, "like one person with one heart."

IN & BEYOND THE CLASSROOM



Even during this challenging year, students, staff, and faculty came together for learning and community building. Learning Torah provided comfort and togetherness. The **Core Semikha Intensive** took place in October in Riverdale, NY and included 28 students from across the globe. The **Advanced Kollel Intensive** took place in January in Jerusalem, Israel.









The inaugural Irene and Julius Horowitz z"l **Bioethics and Halakha Lecture** on the topic "Wartime Medical Ethics: *Halakha* and International Law" explored the timely ethical challenges of international law during a global conflict. Over 230 people attended the January lecture online and in person and heard from Rabbi Saul Berman and Rabbi Lila Kagedan '15.

The inaugural **Alumnae Retreat** brought together 20 graduates, faculty, and staff at the Pearlstone Retreat Center in Maryland for professional development and networking. Session topics included: "Staying Mission Focused and Employee Motivation," "Goal Setting," "Practical Fundraising," and "Demystifying Foundations."







The annual Pastoral Education Yom Iyun, organized by Arielle Krule '25 and Director of Pastoral Education Dr. Esther Altmann, focused on **addiction and the Jewish community**. Maharat partnered with Selah, a community grounded in Jewish tradition for those in recovery and the recovery curious founded by Arielle, to develop a program filled with diverse voices sharing the complexities of addiction.

- Darshanit Dr. Miriam Udel '19 was selected as the The Covenant Foundation Jewish Family Education Fellow.

The third cohort of **Va'tichtov: She Writes**, Maharat's fellowship for elevating Jewish women's voices in writing, featured 12 women who learned together, shared skills, and motivated one another. The final gathering for the fellowship featured speaker Avital Chizhik-Goldschmidt, who inspired over 75 attendees by sharing her own experiences with writing. Work generated from the three cohorts of Va'tichtov has been featured in a wide variety of publications, including *Religion Unplugged*, Sefaria, Urim Publishers, *Times of Israel*, and *The Forward*.






SHOWING UP

Students and alumnae spent the year serving the Israel and the Jewish people through volunteerism, education, and missions to Israel. Maharat distributed \$45,000 in grants supporting travel stipends for the Maharat-Jofa Misson and 19 other projects. Here is a sampling of their impactful work:

- R' Myriam Ackermann Sommer '23 supported her community in Paris by creating a mentally and physically safe space for Jews through enhanced security, a therapist for trauma, and Torah classes.
- R' Dr. Anat Sharbat '15 holds weekly Kabbalat Shabbat and Havdalah services at the empty table in front of the Tel Aviv Museum of Art, serving as a pastoral support and comfort for families of hostages.
- Yali Szulanski '25 coordinated 38 teens who provided support, homework help, childcare, morning support, rides, and more to families in Riverdale, New Rochelle, and Scarsdale whose husbands were called back to Israel to serve.
- R' Alissa Thomas-Newborn '16 organized the Torah of Mental Health Mini-Series, using Torah texts to frame mental health support in this time of trauma, crisis, war, and terror.

EMERGING SCHOLARS AWARD

Three new high school graduates received the prestigious **Emerging Scholars Award.** These exceptional young women demonstrate a commitment to leadership, spirituality, and Torah learning and are part of a cohort offering supplemental programs during their year in Israel. Now in its sixth year, the Award has supported 19 women studying in Israel during their gap year.









FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024 FINANCES

Maharat's budget supports our core activities: ordination and the growth of our global student body, the outward facing community, and alumnae programming. More than half of Maharat's budget directly supports our ordination programs, which includes the cost of full tuition scholarships and stipends for all students. With 75 graduates, we have also increased funding to support their ongoing professional development and placement, while expanding our community learning opportunities through the Center for Lived Torah.
